

A Guide through our Sports Manipulation System

BetNet has been the market leader in sports manipulation in Darknet since the beginning of 2015 and has acted as a very successful partner for successfully placed sports bets ever since.

As many already know, there are countless methods to manipulate sports. In order to stay "under the radar", we have concentrated on the so-called "minor manipulations". This includes so-called "petty corruption", barter systems and match fixing. For the last one, we have specialized in so-called point shaving.

Petty Corruptions are bribes from players, referees and other officials, but in lower leagues or with a lower influence. Bribes of well-known players or officials are difficult because the CECMSC (Council of Europe Convention on the Manipulation of Sports Competitions) monitors them meticulously and you would quickly notice them. Third and fourth leagues in South America, Asia, Africa and some (Eastern) European countries are the better markets for us. We work with a network of dozens of bookmakers and "field agents" in these countries who negotiate the deals with the affected parties and bet on them. We have been doing very well since we started and have always won our daily bets.

Barter systems are probably one of the oldest forms of manipulation and are nowadays often used in sports such as cycling, tennis, golf, track and field and darts. One of our agents is negotiating a deal with both parties A and B. In the first encounter, A will deliberately lose to B, e.g. through discarded darts or a slower run at the end of a sprint. In return, B will deliberately lose to A at the next encounter, so that the two of them will have a tie. This system has existed since the first Olympic Games 2000 years ago.

Match-fixing systems are a method to steer the outcome of live games in the direction we want. We have specialized in the so-called point shaving, which is a hybrid system for us, because you can become active before the match started. Point Shaving is a kind of Spread Betting. This system has many advantages because the costs are very low compared to other systems. With this type you bet on differences in results, number of goals, corners, how many substitutions, handicaps and much more. For example, you bet that team A won't substitute more than 2x and you pay the coach a small fee to keep that. You can also bet on handicaps, and one player (or more players) must make sure that the difference remains the same. They don't lose the game on purpose. Betting on points during a season is also a kind of point shaving, but much more speculative as the factors increase proportionally. That's why we're working on Game-2-Game betting.
